

From the Pastor ... Pastor Ed Milliken



 \mathcal{D} ear Friends in Christ,

When the day of Pentecost had come, they (the followers of Jesus) were all together in one place. Suddenly, from heaven, there came to sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and they began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. (Acts 2:1-4)

When Jesus breathed his last breath on the cross his disciples were crushed and filled with fear. It seemed as though all their hopes and dreams died with him on that dark Friday. But, when Jesus let go of his last breath it did not dissipate and disappear as so many breaths do. Instead, that breath, so full of power and life, grew in strength and in volume until it was a mighty wind, which God sent spinning into an upper room in Jerusalem on the day of Pentecost. God wanted to make sure that Jesus' followers were the inheritors of Jesus' breath, and it worked.

There they were, all moping about and wondering what they were going to do without Jesus, when suddenly they heard a holy hurricane headed their way. Before they could defend themselves that might wind blew in among them. Filling the entire house and striking sparks of flame that rested upon them. And they were filled with it – every one of them – filled to the gills with God's own breath.

As a result of being filled with the power of God some startling things began to occur within them. They began to speak languages that they didn't know. Out of their mouths these strange languages proclaimed the good news of Jesus so that the foreigners gathered in Jerusalem for the festival heard the gospel proclaimed in their own native language. Shy people became bold. Scared people became

gutsy. Lost people gained a secure sense of direction. Disciples, who believed that they couldn't do anything without Jesus, discovered abilities and powers they never knew they had. When they opened their mouths to speak, they sounded like Jesus. When they laid their hands on the sick, it was as if Jesus himself had touched them. They found themselves doing things they had never seen anyone but him do, and there was no explanation for it except that they had dared to breathe on the day of Pentecost.

They had sucked in God's own breath and had been transformed by it. The Holy Spirit had entered them the same way that Spirit had entered into Mary, and for the same reason. It was time for the Son of God to be born again – not in one body this time – but in many, in a body of believers who would receive the breath of life from their Lord then pass it on, using their bodies to distribute the gift. Through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, God performed a feat of artificial respiration in a room full of bumbling, fearful followers turning them into a force that changed the world.

The question for us is: Do we still believe in a God who acts like that? Do we still believe in a God who blows through closed doors and sets hearts on fire? Do we really believe in a God who has the power to transform lives, or do we have a more domesticated and scaled down view of God? Do we believe that with God's presence, God's Spirit, within us, that we too have the power to change the world?

My prayer for you, for me, for Atonement is that we would pray, "Come, Holy Spirit," every chance we get and that, despite our doubts and fears, that Spirit would come among us with power to warm our hearts, enliven our witness, empower our love, and give us the courage and commitment we need to be faithful followers of our Lord in this time and in this place.





We need your help in our deep bed gardens as we raise food for our hungry Newport Food Pantry community. There is a sign-up sheet in the hall way bulletin board. Please call me if you have any questions. Basically once or twice during any week(S) of your choice. The job is to make sure plants are being watered enough. The grounds water timer is set to water Mon. Wed. and Fri. at 4 am for 20 minutes.

During dry spells hand water the beds. We have peas planted around the corner by the playground we need to sprinkle them by hand each week. The hose is right there and the water handle is in my mail box in the Narthex. We are growing a lot of lettuce because we can harvest it and it will grow back over and over again. Just use scissors down near the bottom. We need to cut off any leaves touching the ground to avoid bugs.

Harvest when Newport Food Pantry is open or the day after you harvest. The people who get this fresh stuff absolutely light up when they get some.

Hours are: Tue, & Wed. 2-4pm and Sat. 10 -noon.






