General Fund: Revenues during Feb '22 were \$ 27,584

General fund a much needed boost. Monthly revenue

generally ranges in \$18k -\$10k

Expenses during Feb '22 were \$ 7,443

Which is half of the expected monthly amount due to not

having pastoral compensation and expenses

Net cash flow YTD is \$ 13,702

General Fund balance is \$ 35,471

Capital Fund: Our capital fund revenues from leases are current.

Capital Fund balance is \$ 90,412

Thrivent mortgage balance is \$ 329,016

Dedicated Fund Balance remains at \$ 16,473

I would encourage the ministry committees to review the funds available in the Dedicated Fund report for their use.

Restricted/Endowment balance is \$ 121,014


