RETURNS TO ATONEMENT !!!

Atonement will joyfully welcome classical musicians Andrew Bonner, piano, Rebecca Reese, cello and Alistair Kok, violin, as they return to Newport in the new year to offer another exciting musical performance. The group is well known to the church, with five previous concerts at Atonement beginning in 2014, all of which generated enthusiastic acclaim from our community.

The group calls itself the "Trio Musicorum Medicorum," because each member has a "regular job" in the medical field in the Portland area. Dr. Kok is a dentist, Dr. Bonner is a naturopath, and Dr. Reese is a physician who practices cranial osteopathy and homeopathy.

The trio will offer live music during the morning church service at 10:00 a.m. on Sunday, January 23, 2022 as a preview for their full concert that afternoon at 3:00 p.m. They expect to perform selections by Johann Sebastian Bach, Claude Debussy and Franz Schubert. The trio will ask no admission fee, but will suggest a free-will offering to benefit the Grace Wins Haven shelter. Traci Flower, the shelter's director, will be invited to say a few words about her program at the beginning of the concert.

Proof of vaccination or a negative PCR test for Covid 19 taken at least 72 hours prior will be required to attend the concert. Masks will also be required during the performance.



You all, once again made this Christmas beyond amazing for our families.


