#### **D**ear Church,



Pastor John Smithies

Welcome to Advent. This is a season of preparation and waiting. No church season is more counter cultural than Advent. I invite you into this wisdom and mystery and slow down a bit this year. I say this knowing that Advent in our culture is one of the busiest times of year. There is so much we want to and need to do between Thanksgiving and Christmas that the season becomes just a blur of activity. So much so by the time the 25<sup>th</sup> rolls around, we want the whole Christmas thing to be over. I do get this, and in some real ways this is inevitable, and we are all going to be busy with the bustle of life. But I also invite you to listen to the wisdom of our tradition that says, slow down, wait, prepare. Christmas starts on the 25<sup>th</sup> but then runs for 12 whole days, there is plenty of time, so enjoy the moment, and wait in hope!

And what are we waiting for? Or what is the Christmas Mystery? It is that the powerful divine presence has come near. This presence is most often described in Scripture as a blindingly great light, much like the sun. A light so strong and powerful that we cannot approach it without fear of being burnt up. I think of this fear especially at this time of the year, when I want to go out surfing, but that massive 15-foot wave and the powerful current remind me that at my skill level and ability, to paddle out into that wave would be truly terrifying. The sun is no different. We live lives separated by nature, so we are removed from the analogy, but think of being in the desert without the convenience of the modern world. The sun becomes a great enemy, its heat overwhelming, its rays capable of burning skin. These are images capable of creating a lot of fear of the awesome power that is capable of engulfing and swallowing us whole. We read often in the Old Testament that no one can see God and live. God's glory is too all powerful for our mortal bodies to handle. With this backdrop we hear that the light of God has come and come down to rest in a baby. And we can all look on a child. There is nothing frightening about a child. We can all look upon, hold, and adore a child. And this child is the image for us to see the otherwise unseeable God.

That is the paradox of our faith, the all-powerful God is known in the helplessness of a child. The wisdom of God in-fleshed in the foolishness of becoming us. Richard Rohr once famously said it this way, "When God loves, God becomes that which God loves." And Christ did not just come once into the form of foolishness but always coming to us in the sacrament of the Church and in the living presence of the divine in each of us, which we encounter every time we encounter each other. This is the great mystery of this season, The brightness of God's love comes to us, dispelling the ignorance of our hearts and minds.



T or the month of December, we will be looking deeply at the Gospel of Mark. This most likely will become a December tradition that we look at the Gospel that we will be reading for the coming year. I hope that this time will prepare our hearts to hear what specifically Mark is trying to tell us and how he says is. Please be invited for this time discussion and deep dive into the mystery which is our first Gospel.


