PASTOR JOHN SMITHIES INSTALLED AT ATONEMENT LUTHERAN CHURCH

On Saturday, April 29th, in an afternoon full of joy and celebration, Oregon Bishop Laurie Larson Caesar ordained John Michael Smithies as a pastor of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The public ceremony and church service occurred in the sanctuary of Atonement Lutheran Church. Immediately following that action, Atonement's congregation president Marian Brown formally issued a call for Pastor John to lead the church in ministry. He accepted at once, and Bishop Laurie then officially installed him as the pastor of Atonement Lutheran Church, and ELCA congregation.

This service marked the end of a long period of sadness and uncertainty for the church. In the autumn of 2020, amid the restrictions of the Covid 19 pandemic, Pastor Ed Milliken retired from his 15 years of leadership at Atonement. A few months later, interim Pastor Shelley Willem was diagnosed with cancer which took her life on March 13, 2022. After the church conducted a complex and intricate hiring process, Pastor Jane Baker accepted Atonement's call to ministry. With blessings and love from the church she had served in Roseburg for fourteen years, she and her husband Barry moved to Newport in early 2022. That summer, however, Pastor Baker unexpectedly received her own cancer diagnosis which required an indefinite a medical leave from her duties.

In August, 2022, Bishop Larson Caesar authorized John Smithies to accept an appointment at Atonement as a Bridge minister. At the time, he had just concluded an internship as Vicar at Edmonds Lutheran Church, Edmonds Washington. He had completed all steps required to become an ordained minister in the ELCA and was in the process of seeking his first call. In response to Atonement's need for professional assistance to Pastor Jane while she was on leave and during the early stages of her expected return, John Smithies joined Atonement in what all expected to be a "relief shift." Bishop Laurie granted dispensation for him to perform all the functions of an ordained minister in this capacity, despite his not having been formally ordained.

After Pastor Jane Baker died the day after Christmas last year, Atonement voted to conduct a formal call process to explore the possibility of John Smithies' becoming the church's pastor. On March 19, the congregation unanimously approved the call committee's recommendation that Pastor John, once ordained, be issued a call to become pastor of the church.

Bishop Larson Caesar, recognizing the difficulties Atonement has faced in the past few years, thanked the congregation for its love and faithful ministry during a time of prolonged trial. Several pastors and deacons, including retired Pastor Ed Milliken and Pastor Scott Postlewait of Edmonds, Washington's Advent Lutheran Church, joined the Bishop as participants in the afternoon service. A completely full sanctuary included

many of Pastor John's friends and family, both near and far, who gathered to commemorate Pastor John's ordination as a full minister of Word and Sacrament. Atonement hosted a sumptuous dinner for everyone following the services.

In gratefully accepting his new role with the church Pastor John acknowledged that, "We have all been on this intense journey, both individually and as a community, years of uncertainty and change. So much has forever changed and will be a part of our stories together. And all this time God has been in our midst...and now we start a new chapter of all our lives together and I am ever so thankful and blessed to be here amongst you all. Thank you all for the support, the trust and the welcome of the celebration together."



EXPERIENCE YAKONA NATURE PRESERVE

 \mathcal{N} ewport residents Bill and JoAnn Barton established a private nature preserve on a 430 acre part of a peninsula on Yaquina Bay which once was the land of the Yaq'on [Yakona] people who shared their life peacefully with birds, bear, native plants and trees.

Yakona's director, Natalie Schafer, offers a guided hike in this special place to members and friends of Atonement on **Saturday, July 1, beginning at 10:00 a.m.** The trails involve elevation changes of 250 – 300 feet multiple times over 3+ miles. There will be many stops at historic sites and to talk. The hike will take about three hours.

Plan to meet at the church to carpool to the property by 9:30 that morning. Please also honor the following requests:

- 1) Please sign up on the sheet on the bulletin board in the narthex NO LATER THAN Wednesday, June $\rm 28^{th}$
- 2) No smoking and no pets
- 3) Walking sticks, sturdy hiking boots or shoes, snacks and water bottles are welcome
- 4) There is one restroom at the property. Be prepared to "leave no trace," bringing out anything that you bring in, such as snack wrappers, empty drink bottles, etc.

OREGON SYNOD ASSEMBLY 2023

Pastor John, Sandy Roumagoux, Sabine Maresco and Susan Painter represented Atonement as delegates to the 2023 Oregon Synod Assembly held through Zoom on Saturday May 20. The focus of the gathering was on our Sacred Encounter: engaging God, the self, our neighbors and the world generally, not for control or simply to profit, but rather as Life, full of dignity and worthy of reverence, love and wonder. The greater theme of the gathering was that "We Are Not Alone."

The morning sessions included reports from Bishop Laurie, elections to various Synod offices, and adoption of the budget. With income and expenses only \$68 away from a "balanced budget," the Synod does very much with very little – the entire Synod [including all paid staff] functions with a budget of just over \$1, 300, 000 annually. Nearly \$900,000 of that money comes from Mission Support – regular donations from congregations such as Atonement.

The afternoon sessions included reports from Juan Carlos and Pastor Melissa linking work of collaboration with other churches, institutions, governments and related non profits. As Sandy put it, these presentations provided "the most inspiring and important part of the day, repeating the theme that we are not alone and that the church cannot proceed alone." Sabine points out that the theme, sung as "I am Not Alone," by a Mennonite Choir, wove itself through the examples of difficult situations and subjects, softening and supporting with the knowledge that we must work together.

Complex details like the number of churches seeking pastors and the need for additional money were discussed in realistic ways, but all of the delegates were inspired by learning how very much our Synod does with so little. As Pastor John points out, our Synod not only supports congregations but also brings hope and healing to the world – using the challenges of struggle and tension as an opportunity to rethink how the church should look as we all move forward.

The afternoon concluded with a worship service in which pastors and deacons throughout the state participated by word, song and sacrament. The day was an inspiring way of seeing our statewide church leadership helping us "walk together into courageous love."


