

Dear Church,
Isaiah 45:8 "You heavens above, rain down my righteousness; let the clouds shower it down. Let the earth open wide, let salvation spring up, let righteousness flourish with it; I, the LORD, have created it.

And just like that the rain came! Jen has been asking about winter here, specifically about what type of rain do we get here. I know that sounds like an unusual question, but remember we are from north of Seattle in the part of the pacific northwest where no one on the local news ever says it's going to rain. Why? Because it is always raining. Or I should say more correctly that it almost never rains. It's more of a constant everyday misting. In Seattle, if you turn in to the local news for the weather, they never say rain. Instead, they give you two option, it is either sprinkling or it is drizzling. Now truth be told, I could never figure out which one indicated the severity of the wetness. Either way it was what I call mist. The ever present mist is like walking through the wet sprinklers that are placed in the desert or put above the outdoor sitting area of restaurants. Just wait for it I would tell her; the rain will come. And sure, enough it came this last week, the surf swelled the rain came. There will still be sunny days in the coming month, October always seems full of extremes, clear warm days, clear cold days, colder nights, and lots of rain bringing to our awareness that fall is here.

Isaiah prays that the life and love of God may rain down upon us, for this is the movement of God, God comes down. In a few short months, we will be journeying through Advent as we keenly yearn for the miracle of God's light being born amongst us. As we wait let the rain remind us, that God is always coming down, bringing the rains to water our world with life. May this be a symbol of God's actions for each of us, that the rain drops remind us of our own connection to God through Baptism. For which of us can make the rain fall? Or who can earn this rain? The movement is only and ever from heaven to earth. The rain falls on us, as the love of God comes to us to dwell in us, so that life of God's love may grow in us. And so, the rain falls as surely of God's love comes, and the rain falls on us all, as surely as the love of God falls on us all. I invite you all at some point to stand outside as the rain falls and be reminded of the water that washed over you, connecting you to God's promise and uniting you to the life that is in Christ. 

ARTIST BILL KUCHA TO SHARE ART & OFFER REFLECTIONS

Mearly two years ago on Halloween weekend, a malfunctioning wood stove caused a fire that knocked out power throughout our community for many hours and completely destroyed a home that had been lovingly restored for half a century. Fortunately the owners, renowned artist Bill Kucha and his wife Dorothy escaped safely, but all of his original artwork and the couple's possessions were gone.



About a year before the fire, Bill had completed work on a mixed media "vertical altar in four panels" titled "600 Years." The piece had taken two years to create but it, with about a hundred others, was lost in the flames. Blessedly, Bill had arranged to have the panels be professionally photographed. Now, he has been able to create a full sized reproduction from the photographer's archives. He will share the work with us during the evening of Wednesday, October 25th, beginning at 5:30 p.m. at Atonement.

Most of us know Bill through his sculpture, "the Innercross," which has been part of the Narthex for nearly two decades. The large illuminated cross, Bill says, is a reflection of the light in each of us: "though small in the vastness of chaos, we are, each of us, a magical, blessed and powerful something. Like a Christ, we can heal, create, love and celebrate, regardless of the cross we bear."

All in the community are welcome to come to the church at 5:30 p.m. for coffee and desert while observing and sharing thoughts about "600 Years." At 6:00, we will gather for prayer around and beneath "The Innercross." Bill will share songs and lead a discussion of his newly resurrected "600 Years." The work shows the historical extinctions over the centuries, the alarms around our current climate crisis, and our journey toward a "sixth extinction." The artistic rendering offers a progression from Colonial America to the present, followed by a spiritual revolution awakening the heart and then into the future, where Bill says, will be the "end of the empire era and beginning of the planetary era [as] nation states are transformed into a single world and governance is guided by the ethic, moral and law of love."

We are delighted to welcome Bill to Atonement for this presentation and grateful that he will be sharing this vibrant, newly restored and inspired vertical altar with us.




