Capital Fund: Our capital fund revenues from leases are current.

Our mortgage balance fell below \$ 341,814.13

Happy New Year!!

It's hard to believe that the new year is upon us! I hope that as the turning of this segment of time, that we mark it as a year we might be aware of how the Spirit is actively moving in our midst as a community and in our own lives.

This new year will bring challenges, on a national level we will face a contentious election, polarizing times for sure. But, it is also a reminder for us all to be gracious to each other. Unity in Christ is not predicated on agreement in everything and to seek truth beyond the polarizing topics of the day. Truth is rarely, if ever, found in dualistic thinking, yet dualistic thinking and language is what drives the ever-increasing polarized divide in our country. This I am sure will be a challenge for us all in this coming year, as we seek to maintain the rights and freedoms for those oppressed in our communities, while maintaining a spirit of love, forgiveness, and grace. This year will undoubtedly also bring some new changes to our lives as AI continues to expand and influence the way we live. There most surely will be disruptions like there were last year, and we will grapple with these together, and ask how is the Spirit moving us forward and calling us to be.

Our First Sunday in January will start the Epiphany season of the church, as we read stories where the people of scripture get a glimpse of who Christ truly is. Epiphany is the "I got it now moment." To kick off Epiphany, we are going to start a new tradition for us, but a tradition that is practiced and growing in many of the "Mainline" churches. The tradition is a simple "Star Gift". It is a star to remember that it is on Epiphany that the church marks the traveling of the magi to Bethlehem. The Star guides us to Christ. On this star will be a simple word, you might find it a generic word, or it might be one that immediately has resonance with you, but either way, the discipline is to ponder this word for the rest of the year and open yourselves to how the Spirit might be leading you through it. This is not magic or fortune telling, this is an intentional invitation to prayer and discernment that might lead us to further growth in our Spiritual lives. On the first Sunday of Epiphany, you all will be given the opportunity to reach into a bowl and pull out a star word at random. No cheating by picking out the word, and no exchanges! Then may it be a centering tool for our prayer life a possibility to ponder the meaning while in silence or in words. You are invited to keep your Star gift in any way that is meaningful to you. I often kept it in my Uniform in my vertical coat pocket closest to my heart. I hope this practice brings us joy in the coming year, and may it be a tool to deepen our spiritual journey in the world.





We are still in a deep dive of the Gospel of Mark before returning to our practice of studying the lectionary reading for the coming Sunday. If you ever wanted to ask a question about the Gospels and or the Sunday readings, please feel invited to come on Sunday morning at 9am.

I don't have any details beyond this, but our Council was also excited to be a part of this. I will be meeting with Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon in the first part of January so will have more information after that! May this new year be an opportunity for us to connect and ride the wave of grace and truth, may we be together amidst the storms that will come, frolic in the sunshine of God's love, and be a safe harbor for those needing rest. 
