Pentecost by Pastor John

E very year for 50 days, after Easter the church celebrates E Pentecost. Our main symbol on Pentecost is the fire of the Spirit's presence. The symbols are a little different than the symbol of breath or wind that we typically use for the presence of the Spirit. We invite you all to wear red in remembrance that the flame of the Spirit lives in us. In some ways Pentecost is the birth of the Churches ministry, the moment of transition from this Jesus movement that is for us, to the ministry of spreading the good news to all nations. We will remember this in our service we will be doing things a little different to highlight these symbols. And the great mystery is that God uses us to reach out into the world. What a great joy to know that we are given this purpose, to be the hands and feet of God for the world.

That leads me to what I am excited to talk about. After service we will be hosting a ministry fair in the narthex with the chance to see and hear all the different ministry work, we do. And yes, all this ministry takes actual hands and feet to do. I realize we might not do as good a job as we should in letting people know what we do and providing opportunities to help be a part of the ministry. And that is the really exciting part because everyone can play a role here, because if everyone does a little even just now and then, it goes miles accomplishing the work and might enable more dreams and vision. Sometimes we might approach this as an all or nothing thing, like I have to do everything, or I can do nothing. But this is simply not true. Because there are always the little things that can be done and now and then that

 \mathbf{T} know I have been here longer than 1 year. But, this last Sunday marked a year $m{I}$ from the date of my Ordination. What an amazing journey it has been so far. And I wanted to take the moment to express my gratitude and love once again to you all, and to the community. We have been through some tough moments this last year and will go through some tougher moments in the years to come. But whatever comes we will face it as a community held together by the promises of the Gospel. We recently read the Hidden Message in Water by Masaru Emoto, in that book regardless of how we view his experiments of water, he made the claim that the two most powerful forces in the world are Gratitude and love. And I think we could all say a lot about gratitude and love. Indeed, our Scriptures say a lot about it. What is thanksgiving but another word for gratitude. Take these two together and you're dealing with almost every single page of the Bible. But these two forces are so interesting because they cannot be compelled. You cannot make someone love; you cannot make someone grateful. You can't guilt someone into these things or brow beat them. You can't even bribe someone into either. You can give someone everything, and yet they can still become ungrateful. We have all certainly known people who seem to have the world, and yet seem so miserable. They don't value what they have. This is why in our tradition these are called fruits of the Spirit because they are cultivated deep within us. We love because God first loved us, we are grateful because of the grace we have been given.

Gratitude is not some naïve worldview that does not see the bleakness of reality or the troubles that are out there. It is not turning a blind eye to reality. It's instead an appreciation for what you have been given. I think gratitude is seeing everything as a gift. And if you couple gratitude with love then you are on fire. Then the question becomes one of sharing. How do I share the grace that I have been given? How might I move in the world so all have the same opportunities, how can I raise up others. How can we live together with my neighbor with mutual love and gratitude. I know that this might sound "pie in the sky," hopelessly optimistic, but the only start I can make is with my own soul, as Jesus says, "look at the plank in your own eye before trying to remove the splinter from your neighbor." Love and Gratitude can change the world.

Again, I just want to say how thankful and grateful I am that I am your pastor. It is a true gift to be here with you. May we cultivate our hearts to be thankful for the gifts






Men's Breakfast Group

Title: The Memory Weaver Author: Jane Kirkpatrick

 ${\cal T}$ he fascinating part of reading this book is that the setting is the Willamette Valley and the Walla Walla area of Washington. Towns of Brownsville, The Dallas, Ft. Vancouver are all woven into the novel.

This is the story of Eliza Spaulding and is based on the extensive research of the author from the memoir of the real pioneer woman, Eliza Spaulding who lived during the 1840's-1850's. Her life was influenced from a family life of missionaries.

Eliza caries a tremendous emotional burden as she and two other children were held hostages during the Whitman Massacre until rescued by the army.

I found this book to be really interesting as the author has told a compelling and believable story which was very well written.

Gift Cards This program provides an emergency meal card for people who stop by the church and need help. Raynette will be purchasing \$10 food cards from Food vendors as funds are available.




Support for Ukraine's Refugees ... funds collected will be sent to our sister churches in Poland for Ukraine refugee relief every six months.
